The Movable Feasts and Festivals of the Church Year

The Movable Feasts and Festivals all depend upon Easter, except Advent. *Advent Sunday* is always the nearest Sunday to the thirtieth day of November, whether before or after. *Easter* is always the first Sunday after the Full Moon which happens upon or next after the twenty-first day of March; and if the Full Moon happens upon a Sunday, Easter is the Sunday after. The time of Easter being found, the other Feasts and Festivals occur as follows:

Septuagesima Sunday is nine weeks before Easter. *Ash Wednesday*, or the beginning of Lent, is forty-six days before Easter. *Palmarum*, or the beginning of Holy Week, is seven days before Easter. *Maundy Thursday* is the Thursday before Easter. *Good Friday* is the Friday before Easter. *Ascension Day* is forty days after Easter. *Whitsunday* is seven weeks after Easter. *Trinity Sunday* is eight weeks after Easter.


